Replacing Icicle, Aleutian Spray Fisheries bought 50% share in 2004.) | \$402,307 | | | Ben held secret option to buy 25% of Adak Fisheries for a nominal fee at the same time Ted created an exclusive, in perpetuity pollock allocation that benefited the company. The allocation is worth at least \$10 million annually. Payments were to Advance North LLC, owned by Ben and Trevor McCabe. | | | Ted appropriated \$25 million to buy back fishing permits from Southeast Alaska salmon seine fleet.
